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
Bejeweled Christmas Tree Wall Hanging (page 2 of 3)

Supplies

- Background fabric (9 x 12 inches)
- Backing fabric (9 x 12 inches)
- Two 3.5-inch squares of backing fabric to make the corner hangers (optional)
- Thin batting (9 x 12 inches)
- Fabric for binding (or purchased bias tape)
- Steam a Seam 2 fusible web (or similar) (approximately 8 x 8 inches)
- Fabric for tree (6 x 7 inches)
- · Scraps for "gifts"
- Assortment of beads to decorate the tree (this is a good time to use your old jewelry!)
- Assortment of thin ribbon to decorate the gifts
- Iron
- · Sewing machine
- Thread
- Sewing needle
- Beading needle
- Wooden chopstick (or similar piece of dowel)

Instructions

- Using the templates on the following page, trace the tree and gifts on the paper side of the fusible web.
- 2. Using an iron, adhere the glue side to the **wrong** side of the tree and gift fabrics following manufacturer's instructions.
- 3. Center the tree on the right side of the background fabric, and arrange the gifts in a way you find pleasing.
- 4. Using an iron, press the tree and gifts to the background fabric (following manufacturer's instructions).
- 5. Make a sandwich of the top, batting, and backing and machine or hand quilt as desired. (I used spirals to emulate swirling snow on the sample quilt.)
- 6. Trim the quilted sandwich so the edges are even and the corners are square.
- 7. (Optional) Fold the two 3.5-inch squares into triangles. Pin them to the upper two corners on the back of the sandwich. Stitch in place very close to the edge, as shown at right.
- 8. Bind the quilt.
- 9. (Optional) Cut the chopstick or dowel to the width of the quilt and insert into the corner triangles.



Note: Feel free to decorate the tree and gifts any way your heart desires! Add small trinkets under the tree, such as miniature toys.
